
To celebrate, the two winning classes were treated to some hot chocolate - I was more than happy to join them for this! I am looking forward to seeing the results of the next tournament.


Please remind children to complete their times table games every week (and maybe next time it will be their class who are the winners).





## Year 6 Science







# Year 2 Writing


