Work Spotlight – Year 3 and Nursery

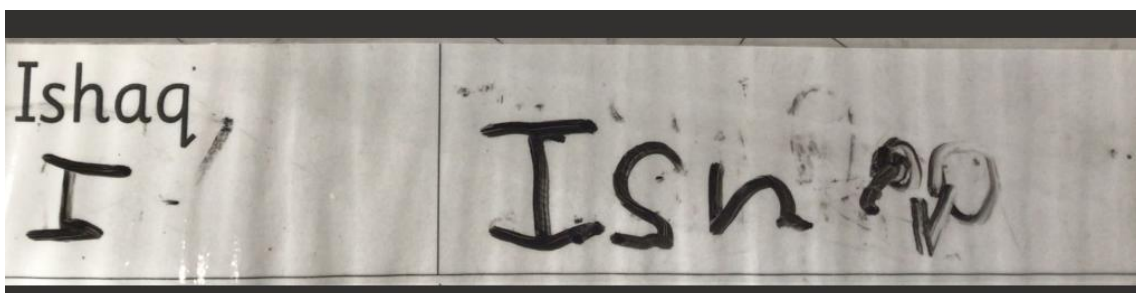
