

Reading Records KS1

Your child should be reading 5-7 times per week. When you read to them or they read with your support, it is expected to be recorded in their reading record. In KS1, we expect that this will be written most often by an adult. Children in year 2 may begin to record their comment themselves as they progress through the year. Please see below some examples of what can be recorded.
