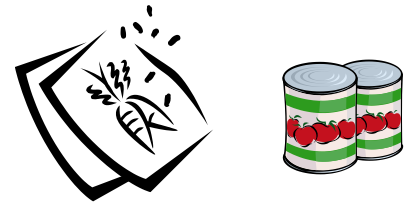

They are very excited and appreciative of our potential donation and would like to thank you in advance for your support.

The Only Saturday night project that provides food and emergency supplies for the homeless and most vulnerable people in the city of Peterborough.

The project is based in a church hall in the centre of Peterborough. We are able to provide a hot meal, hot pudding, hot & cold drinks, a toiletry bag, clothing, bedding and emergency supplies. We also aim to listen to people's concerns, problems and feelings trying to move them away from living on the streets assisting wherever possible.

We have no funding as such, as a project we survive on donated food and toiletry items. We do receive items such as bric a brac, books, cd's etc which are sold on a charity stall and the money goes towards food for the project. Occasionally we receive cash donations which are gratefully received and are put to extremely good use.

It costs roughly £50 a week to supply food and toiletry items for 40-65 people who regularly attend the project. We do not waste anything!! We go around like the borrowers all week finding items we require for the project and individual needs.
