## **Our Curriculum**

## **Topic**

This term we are starting our Ancient Greece topic. The children will be reading and analysing a book called 'Who let the Gods out?' this term. They will be finding out about life in Ancient Greece, the Olympic Games and Greek Gods and Goddesses. Our writing will include various non-fiction genres including persuasive writing, recounts, non-chronological report and narrative, as well as story writing, which should be fun! We will be including lots of short bursts of writing and grammar games to encourage a love of writing.

### **Science:**

In Science, the children will be learning about life cycles of plants and animals. We will also be exploring different materials and their properties and uses.

## **Reading:**

Please read with your child regularly and sign their reading record each week. We will be continuing to use the 'Destination Reader' scheme that develops the children's ability to talk about the books that they have read and are currently studying 'Who let the Gods out' by Maz Evans.
