# Nursery Summer Curriculum 2024

## **Our Curriculum**

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development:** Following rules and routines; supporting new children starting Nursery, sharing, responding to new experiences like visits to new places and sports days, transition to school

Communication and Language: Sharing ideas with a talk partner and listening to their responses; asking and answering what, who, where, when questions, talking about the stories we have read, talking in simple sentences in a range of contexts **Physical Development:** Developing our pencil grip and control; forming patterns and letters from our name when writing; dance; ball games; throwing and catching

Phonics: environmental sounds, developing an awareness of rhythm and rhyme and exploring speech sounds for our younger children and oral blending and initial sounds for our older children

Literacy: Writing patterns in wiggle and squiggle, mark making during play, writing letters from our names, retelling stories, ordering parts of stories and drawing story maps, writing sounds

**Maths:** shape; numbers 1-5, counting items to 5, representing 5 in different ways, positional language, subitising to 5, comparing quantities, height and length

**Understanding the World:** Changing seasons spring and summer, weather, growing plants, different celebrations we and others celebrate, people who are special to us, what happens at the farm, life cycles, life in another country, holidays,

**Expressive Arts and Design:** using textures to create pictures, pictures of animals, colour mixing, printing, rhyme time

Books and Reading - Your child will be bringing home a storybook on Mondays and Wednesdays. It would be really helpful if your child could have a named book bag to put the book in. Please read with your child regularly as this is a good habit to get into ready for the start of Reception.



**Drop off and Collection: -** Please ensure your child is in school on time each day. Our doors open at 8.30am and the gates close at 8:40am for the morning session and your child should be collected by 11:30am. In the afternoon your child should begin at 12:30. Collection is from the classroom at 3.00pm until 3:30pm (2.00pm in line with the rest of school - 3:30pm on Fridays).
