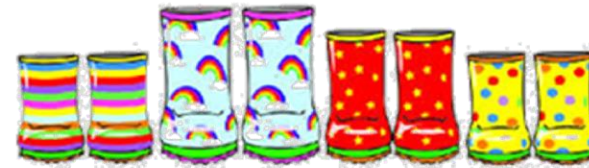
Tapestry:

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Our Curriculum:

Our work this term will be focussed around stories about transport, animals, bears, families and the farm. We will also be doing work based on Mother's day, Spring and Easter. All work will be based around the 7 areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum (EYFS) which are:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language (Speaking and listening)
- Physical Development
- Literacy (Reading and writing)
- Numeracy
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design (Creative activities including role play, art, music and dancing)

Within planned learning we will be focussing on shape recognition and their properties, listening skills, pencil control, counting to 10, scissor skills, name recognition, early name writing and emergent writing.

If your child is ill please remember to telephone the school office on the first day of the absence. Registers have to be kept daily and we need to include absences with reasons. May we also remind you that we finish at **11.30am** and **3.30pm**. Please collect your child on time, as staff usually attend meetings and clubs after 3.30pm.
